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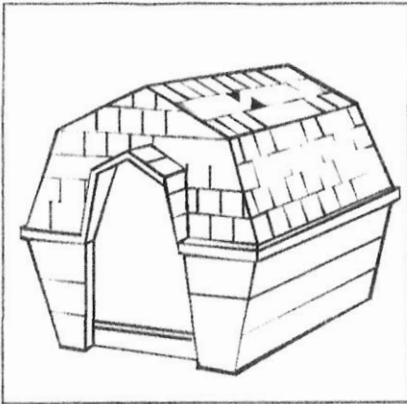

PORTABLE PET DISASTER SUPPLY KIT

Plan in advance for the care of your pet. Planning could save your pet's life. Have a portable pet disaster supply kit. Make sure your pet is familiar with the portable kennel or carrier you plan to use. Remember that pets become anxious and stressed just as human do in emergencies.

1. **COLLAR or HARNESS with ID tags & LICENSE attached.**
2. **LEASH**
3. **MEDICATIONS and MEDICAL RECORDS (include rabies and other shot records) along with a Pet First Aid kit stored in ziplock bags**
4. **FOOD and WATER with a bowl and can opener**
5. **A favorite PET TOY**
6. **TAG = YOUR VETERINARIAN'S name and phone #**
7. **TAG = CONTACT name, phone #, and address outside the area in case you are separated from your pet**
8. **TAG = PETS name and OWNERS name, phone #, and address**
9. **Small plastic bags for collection of pet waste.**
10. **A recent PICTURE of you and your pet placed inside the pet carrier in a ziplock bag.**
11. **LITTER for cats.**
12. **Hand Towel**
13. **PORTABLE KENNEL large enough for your pet to stand, turn around and lie down comfortably.**
14. **Animal First Aid Kit**

You may have other items for your kit that you consider essential.

Disaster Supplies Kit Checklist for Pets

Assemble as many of these items as possible and store them in an easily accessible location in case of evacuation

- Medications
- Medical Records (in waterproof zip-lock bag or other container)
- First aid kit
- Sturdy leashes, harnesses and / or carriers
- Long term confinement equipment
- Current photos in case your pet gets lost
- Food (3 day supply)
- Potable water, bowls
- Cat litter / pan, scoop bags
- Can opener
- Information on feeding schedules, medical conditions, behavior problems
- Name and number of vet and local animal shelter
- Pet toys and bed if easily transportable
